We are back at it again this summer! We will be working on two Saturday morning trout habitat improvement projects on July 22 and August 5. We scheduled two dates hoping more volunteers will be able to fit at least one date into their busy summer schedules.


July 22: we're returning to the Brule headwaters for maintenance work on the Beaupre Spring's tributary. We're planning to continue last summer's project here by cutting alder that slumped into the stream during last winter's heavy snowfall. Bring gloves, hip boots/waders and any lopping tools you may have.

August 5: we'll be removing a small man-made earthen dam at the headwaters of Swamp Angel creek. By removing the dam we'll be drain-

ing the impoundment to directly reconnect the inflowing springs with the creek, lowering the tributaries water temperatures. Bring gloves and shovels.

We're asking volunteers to meet at the Upper St. Croix boat landing at 9 a.m. each Saturday (landing is located on the Northeast end of the lake just off County Hwy. A). From there, we'll

drive to the project locations. After a morning's work, we'll return to the landing to enjoy a Club prepared lunch

Minutes of the May Meeting: The minutes as written in the June newsletter were approved following a motion by Dennis Smet, second by Dean Wellman, and unanimous approval by voice vote.

Habitat: Dennis Pratt – APHIS trapper harvested two beavers at Beaupre spring pond and removed the dam, reducing the water level by two thirds. Three dams were seen from aerial fly over on the West Fork. The APHIS trapper harvested the beaver responsible for those and removed all the dams. In July, the habitat volunteers will be at the Beaupre Creek area removing alder bent over into the stream by the heavy snow last winter. In August, removal the Angel Creek man-made pond is the planned project.

Brule River Sportsmen's Club 'Trees for Trout' Project Saturday, May 20

Ten volunteers met at 9 a.m. at the Upper St. Croix boat launch.

This was the Club's way of celebrating Arbor Day 2023. Over the last decade, the Club has performed

habitat improvement work by draining those beaver ponds and reconnecting the spring flow of Beaupre Spring Pond with the Brule River.

Before our restoration work, waters from the Spring Pond completely evaporated off the four very large beaver pond surfaces instead of reaching the Brule. That spring water connection

has been restored by the Club for over a decade now.

In this stage of our habitat work we planted 500 tamarack and about 100 spruce trees along the trout channel now flowing from the Spring Pond through two of the four the old beaver pond footprints to eventually re-establish an evergreen stream-side forest on the banks the Beaupre tributary to the Brule River previously destroyed by beaver occupation. The trees were provided by the Brule River State Forest. Forester, Dave Schulz provided tree planting instructions on site.

At noon we gathered once again at the Upper St. Croix boat launch and enjoyed a Club provided subsandwich lunch.
