Steelhead Caught Eighty-Six Years Ago



Marlys McGettigan caught this 35-inch 11-pound steelhead on May 3, 1937. The post spawn female had a 17-inch girth. The skin seems to be mounted on a piece of left over siding used on the DNR ranger station. This was a common way to mount trophy fish during this era. We discovered this mount in the basement of the DNR ranger station in 1985. You can look at this fish in the museum at the Brule Fish Hatchery.

President Dennis Pratt canceled the meeting due to weather, meeting held via email.

Officers and Directors: Ed Chaplinski, Glen Hill, Mick Killoren, Ken Lundberg, Dennis Pratt, Mike Sierszen, Dennis Smet, Jeff Stollenwerk, Walt Swanson, Jim Waletzko, Dean Wellman, Mike Zicus and Ken Zivic responded to emails.

Minutes of the January Meeting: The minutes as written in the February newsletter were approved following a motion by Walt Swanson, seconded by Dean Wellman, and a majority approval by email vote.

Glo Bug Egg Yarn Fly

The use of artificial materials to imitate fish eggs has allowed a vast array of different fly patterns to be developed. When Glo Bug yarn became available, it was immediately adopted by "yarn fisherman." Mike Skeba, Ron

Pearson, and Rob Miller were some of the pioneers that I was fortunate to know who used yarn on the Brule.

The perfect rig was a 7- or 8-wt fly rod balanced with a reel just heavy enough to cause the tip to rise slightly in your hand. Maxima Ultragreen in 8 lb. test was the go to line. Two BB's provided a good amount of weight to start with. Adding or subtracting weight was common for different runs and pockets. The rule became the lighter the weight the better.

Contact with the stream bottom was not necessary. When you were in the zone with the fly, any hesitation in the line required a quick hook set. Yarn flies in sizes from 1/4 inch to 3/8 inch in diameter were the norm depending on water clarity.
