A Concert Celebrating The 50th Anniversary of Earth Day

Song for The Wild is songwriter/producer Warren Nelson's latest creation, a multi-media concert celebrating the legacy of **Sigurd Olson**, one of America's greatest conservationists of the twentieth century. The first half of the show features the writings of Olson, put to song by Nelson and back-dropped by projected photos of him and his beloved outdoors.

Nelson says, "As everyone in the Northland knows, Sigurd Olson was one of the great voices of the 20th century for saving wilderness areas and wild places. He was a principal savior of the *Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness*, and his voice carries on to the following generations. I have put his lyrical prose to song, and it's amazing how his words easily fit to melody." Many of the historic and contemporary photographs were gathered from the Listening Point Foundation archives at the Olson home in Ely.

The second half of the show features original songs by Nelson, which sing of wildlife and the environment. Also included are tributes to:

Gaylord Nelson, Wisconsin's Senator, the founder of *Earth Day*; Rachel Carson, scientist and author of *Silent Spring*; Willard Munger, local conservation hero; and other well-known twentieth century conservationists such as John Muir "Father of the National Parks" and Aldo Leopold, ecologist, environmentalist and the father of the *Wilderness Society*.

The *Song For The Wild* musical ensemble includes Nelson on guitar, Randy Sabien on violin and piano, Ed Willett on cello, Jane Aleckson on bass and Kevin Soulier on vocals.

Joseph is but one incredible example! Leading up to the showings of *Song for the Wild*, there will be a studentlead discussion where youth can meet and learn from Joseph and other local young heroes.
