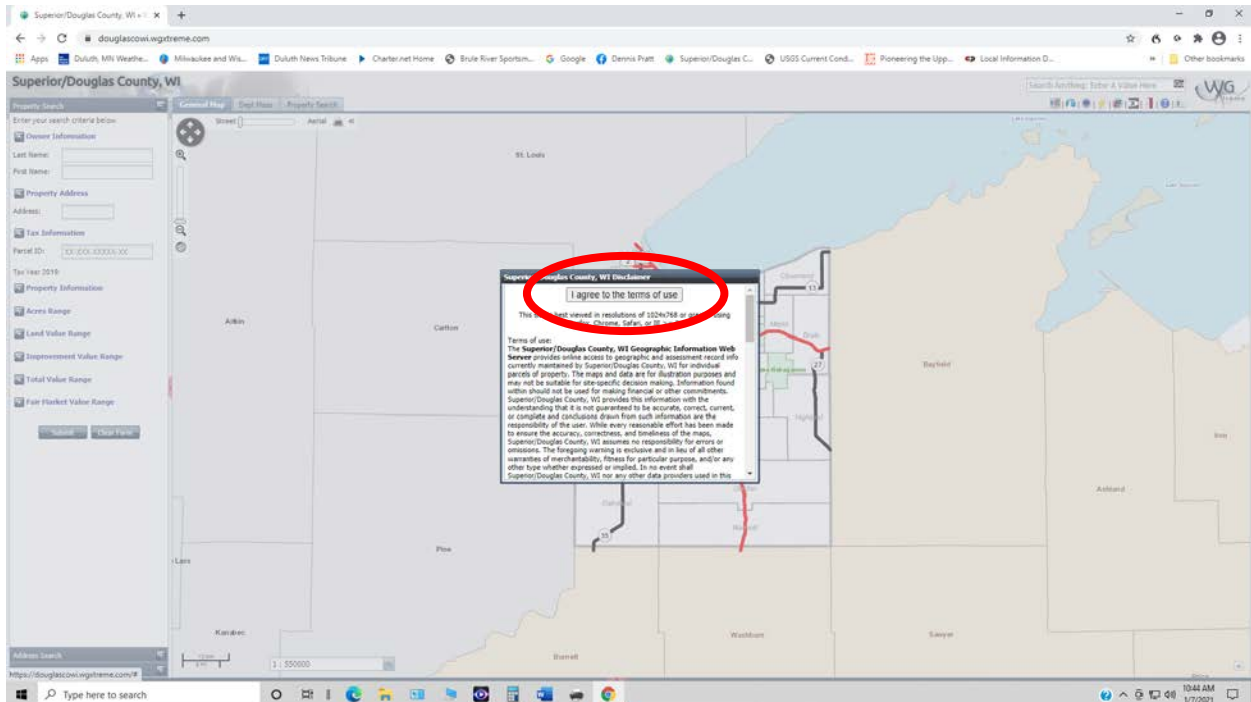


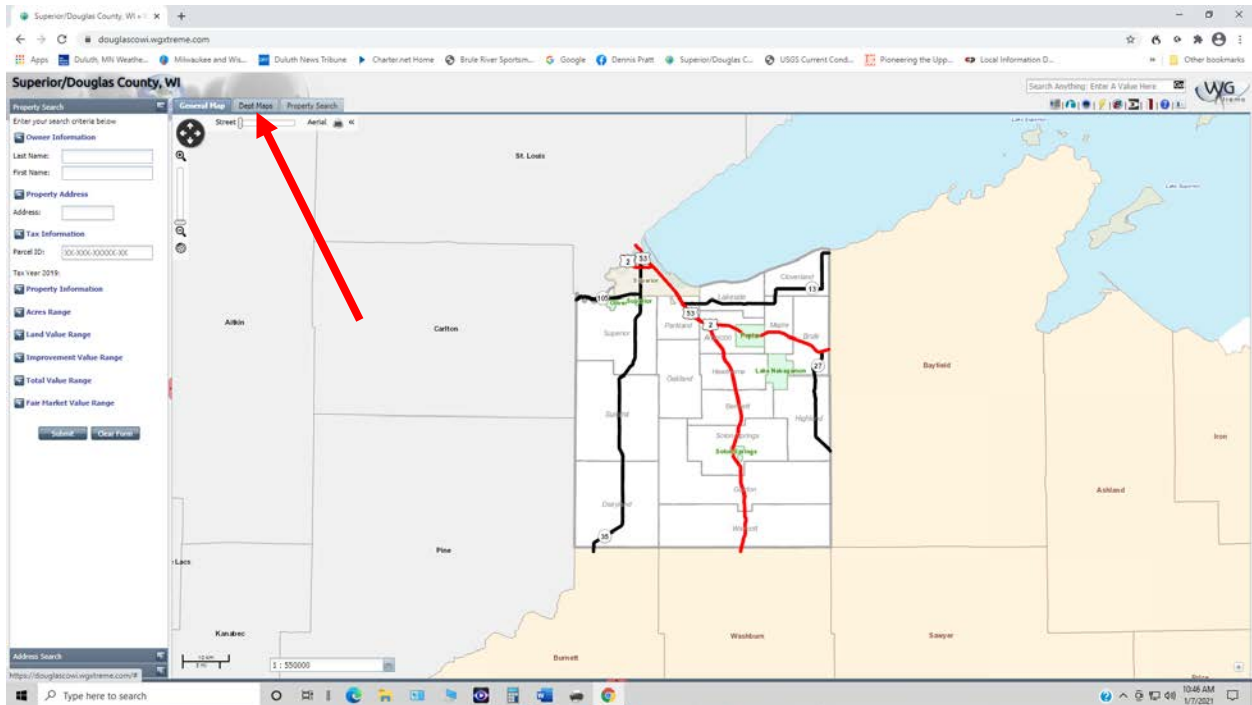
Using Douglas County Wisconsin GIS Data to Determine Land Ownership along the Brule River

Step (1) Type “Douglas County Wisconsin GIS” into your browser’s address bar or go to <https://douglascowi.wgxtreme.com/> using a left mouse click.

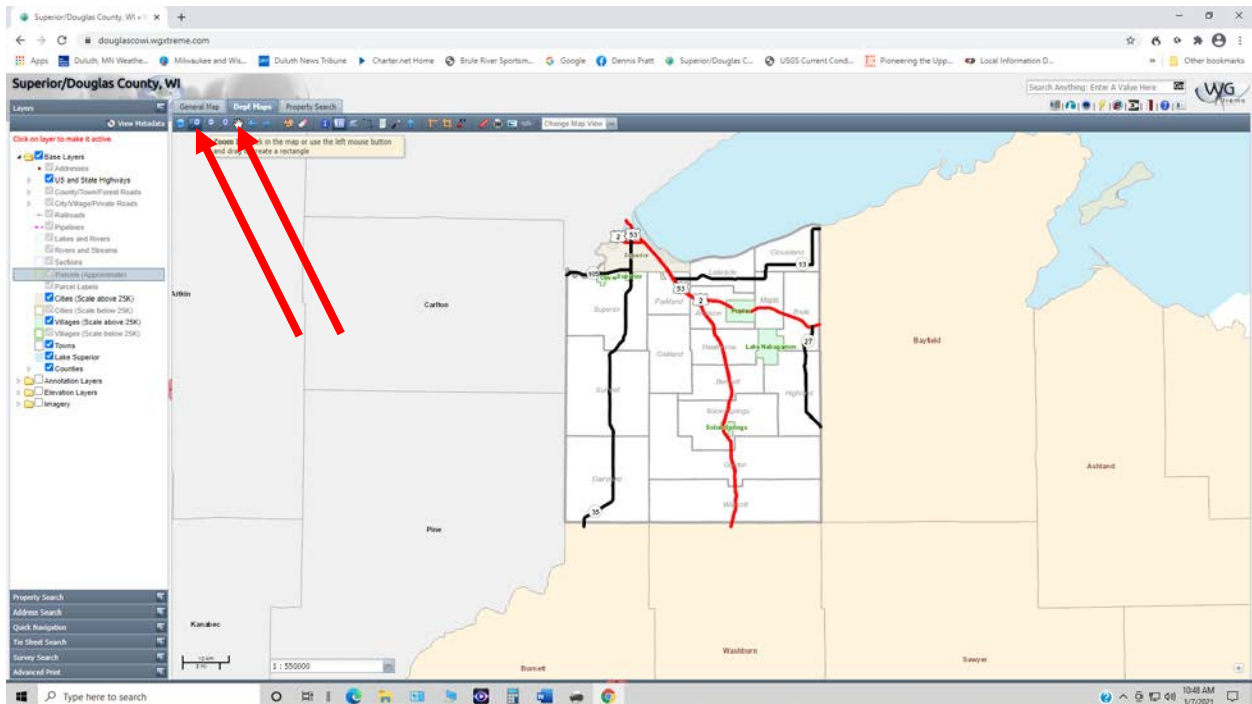
Step (2) Read the terms of use on the website and click on “I agree to the terms of use” in the text box in the center of the page.



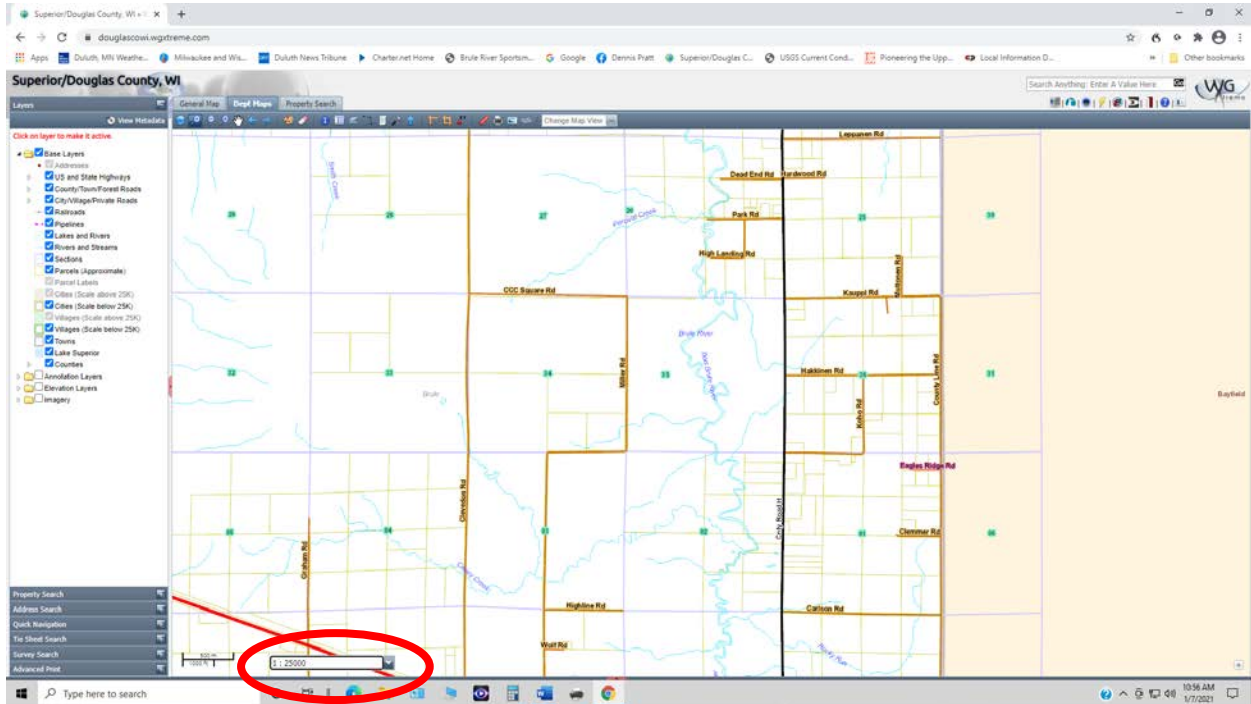
Step (3) Select the “Dept Maps” tab located just above the top left edge of the map.



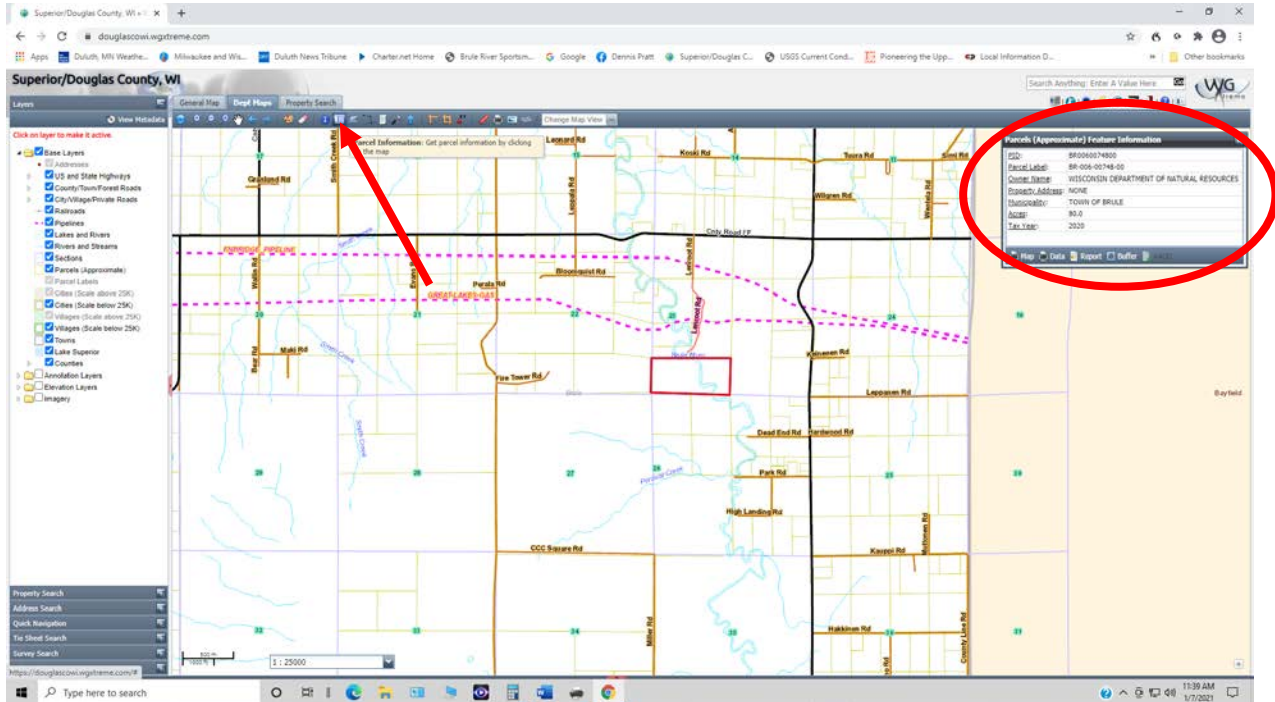
Step (4) To enlarge or zoom into a section of the map, use the Zoom In tool (magnifying glass button with the plus sign on it), which is found in the top margin of the map. Follow the instructions to zoom in. Then click on the Pan / Zoom tool (hand icon button to the right of the Zoom In button) and use your cursor to move the map to the location you are interested in.



Step (5) On the map's bottom left side, use the left mouse button to click the down arrow and move your cursor to select a scale of at least 1:25000. This will zoom in enough to display ownership parcels outlined in yellow.



Step (6) Click the “Parcel Information” button, then point your cursor at a parcel, and click on it. A box with the parcel ownership information will appear in the upper right corner of the map. See the example below. Use the Pan / Zoom tool to move the map around and repeat the process to view the information for any other parcels you might be interested in.
